6. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Legislative Update

Dr. VanWagoner updated the board on the governor's proposed school budget, noting positive aspects including increased per-pupil funding, although still short of what was hoped for. He discussed the need to advocate for mental health and school safety funding. The final budget is expected in October, requiring the district to begin the school year with budget uncertainty. He affirmed ongoing collaboration with legislators and advocacy groups.

9. **DISCUSSION**

a. Meeting Schedule

President Newman-Bale explained there would be some changes in meeting dates and then deferred to Trustee Raymond. Trustee Raymond read his letter of resignation from his Board position due to a change in his professional career. President Newman-Bale thanked him for his service and then discussed the process of appointing a new Board Member. The position will be posted and the new Board member will be appointed at the next meeting on March 10, 2025. If there are a large number of applicants, a meeting will be held on March 3, 2025, to narrow down the finalists. There was also discussion about the upcoming Study Sessions in April.

b. School Safety Update

Dr. VanWagoner shared that the TCAPS Emergency Operations Team recently met for the second time this year to discuss and update school-specific emergency operation plans, assess security technologies, refine reunification procedures, review relevant legal updates, and identify professional development opportunities for staff. The team researches best practices, collaborates with law enforcement, and seeks innovative solutions to enhance school security, ensuring a proactive approach to student and staff safety and fostering a culture of preparedness within the district.

c. Amendment to the 2024/2025 General Fund Budgets and School Service Funds (Food Services program, Student/School activities fund, Community Services)

Christine Thomas-Hill, Associate Superintendent of Finance and Operations reviewed the amendment and

explained that the projected fund balance draw has improved from \$3 million to \$2 million, with potential for further improvement by final budget adoption in June.

i. West Senior High Circulation/Long Lake Driveway Expansion:

Christine Thomas-Hill explained that the West Senior High circulation project is a large project that also includes a smaller addition at Long Lake Elementary: an expansion of the right turn lane to improve traffic flow. This project at West Senior High will span two summers. The first summer will focus on a major renovation along Herkner Road, in collaboration with the Grand Traverse County Road Commission. This phase will include a traffic light at Herkner, a sidewalk, a bus loop, a parking lot, and drop-off areas. The second summer will involve additional parking construction and some redesign of the athletic drop-off areas.

Approval to award the contracts as recommended by Miller-Davis Construction Manager for this project, for a total amount not to exceed \$4,458,366 which includes a 10% contingency; funded from Capital Bond Funds.
