### 7. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

## a. Legislative Update

Dr. VanWagoner presented an unsolicited \$167,000 offer for the Potter Road property to the Board, stating he was not planning on entertaining it and asking them for their thoughts. The response is due by April 18, 2025.

Dr. VanWagoner discussed the insulin lawsuit that TCAPS was part of and whether or not the Board wanted to continue to pursue it. This item was moved to discussion.

During conversations with Tim Kelly, Dr. VanWagoner expressed that while the transportation categorical funding is good, the Republican-passed bill providing \$10,025 per student is positive, but primarily a political maneuver. Nevertheless, it underscores the urgency of establishing a school budget by July 4, a sentiment shared by Representative John Roth.

Dr. VanWagoner is working to secure a "hold harmless" clause concerning 31-A funds, aiming to prevent a \$1 million reduction. He is contacting all involved entities to raise awareness and facilitate this change.

- Traverse City West High School girls and boys Alpine Ski both finished as runners up in the Division 1 State finals.
- Traverse City West's Matthew Quigley finished third in the state at the MHSAA Wrestling finals at Ford Field.
- The VASA Ski club boys team won the state championship, including a second place finish from West's Liam Wierzba.

### **Central Grade Visioning**

A 25-member team, composed of Central Grade stakeholders, including staff, parents, neighborhood representatives, board members, city officials, and students, convened twice to establish high-level priorities for the Central Grade project. Architectural and construction management professionals guided the discussions, and the resulting priorities will be presented at the April 14, 2025 Board of Education meeting.

### **Blair Elementary School**

Reading Month celebrations are in full swing and staff is incorporating things learned through the Science of Reading including:

- Hosting a "March Madness" style book bracket, with daily classroom and staff voting to determine the school's favorite book.
- Second Grade Classes gathered for Cocoa and Reading time.
- Reading Night will be held March 18, the theme is Bedtime Stories. Ann Tisdale and Mighty
  Miss Maya are coming to read to the school. In preparation for the event, three vocabulary
  words were identified from the story that students may not know, each word has been
  assigned a week to be the "Secret Word". The goal is for students to hear that word so often

that they are able to guess the secret word of the week by Friday - and also define/use it correctly.

The TC Titans robotics team had a strong performance in their opening competition at Lake City, including being selected as the first robot in the alliance selection.

### b. School Safety Update

- The Michigan State Police Office of School Safety is currently hosting Behavioral Threat Assessment and Management ('BTAM') training around the state, and TCAPS staff will be in attendance. Public Act 272 of 2024, recently signed by the Governor, requires all K-12 schools to have a behavior threat assessment and management team by October 1, 2026. The BTAM model is what the district currently uses when a threat is received, to safely assess, evaluate, and provide needed support services for everyone involved.
- TCAPS is currently providing CPR and AED professional development at each building across the district, training between six and ten staff members per site. This is a 2-year certification taught by current staff members in administration, transportation, and licensed child care. As you can imagine, this is a large task that requires additional training of instructors, time constraints, and oversight of current and needed recertifications. We are interested in streamlining this process, and are exploring ways to ensure that all necessary personnel are trained efficiently and effectively. This may include redistributing workloads or identifying additional resources to support these efforts.
- TCAPS school buses are currently being inspected by Michigan State Police as required by law on an annual basis.
