6. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Architect Update for Central High School, Music Project and Central Grade

Dr. VanWagoner introduced Christine Thomas-Hill, Assistant Superintendent of Finance and Operations. Ms. Thomas-Hill explained that she was bringing options to the Board for three capital projects, Central High School, secondary music projects, and Central Grade. She stated that these projects are currently in the discovery phase and that some high-level decisions need to be made before the design phase for these projects can begin. She invited architects from the Central High School and secondary Music projects to the table:

Tracy Ezell from TMP Architecture, Mark Hammitz with Cornwell Architects, and Jack Abate, Construction Manager from Miller Davis make up the team for these projects. The major talking points were budget, timeline and whether renovations or demolition and additions were needed. A complete link to the presentation for all three projects can be found here: Ms. Thomas-Hill then introduced the design team for Central Grade School, John Dancer with Cornerstone Architects, Gabe Alvey from Diekema Hamann, and Jack Abate. She explained the visioning committee process and the items that were considered high priority among the committee. After discussion, it was decided that Ms. Thomas-Hill and the teams for these projects could move forward with some more specific plans, and that more discussion would be needed before anything could be approved.

District Highlights

TCAPS Innovation & Manufacturing Centers both held ribbon-cutting ceremonies on April 10, 2025.

Certificate of Excellence-For the twentieth consecutive year, TCAPS has been awarded the Certificate of Excellence in Financial Reporting for its Annual Comprehensive Financial Report (ACFR), recognizing the district's dedication to financial transparency and excellence.

TCAPS K-12 District Art Show -opening was held April 10 at Glenn Loomis. The show will run through April 25–all are welcome to attend Monday-Friday 9am-4pm, at the TCAPS Administration building-Glenn Loomis

Drug Abuse Resistance Education (D.A.R.E) - Fifth graders at Cherry Knoll participated in an updated/pilot program for D.A.R.E. and a graduation ceremony was held for them. Grand Traverse County Sheriff's Department Deputy MaKenzie Kreiner taught the 5th grade students about Risks and Consequences, Stress, Communication Styles, Bullying, Alcohol/Tobacco, Resistant Strategies, Vaping, Dare Decision Making Model, and Help Networks. Cherry Knoll is the first school in TCAPS to have started this program after several years.

West Senior High German American Partnership Program (GAPP) - has been recognized by the US Department of State for its outstanding support of the 2024 GAPP. This honor highlights TC West's commitment to fostering international understanding and providing invaluable youth exchange opportunities. Kerry LaBonte has been instrumental in this program.

9. DISCUSSION

a. School Safety Update

Dr. VanWagoner shared that last fall, one of our TCAPS families reached out to Trustee Ballenger about a grant focused on the cardiac health and well-being of our students. Patrick McManus applied for the grant and worked very closely with the foundation over the last couple of months. This involved numerous communications, detailed documentation outlining the necessity for AEDs within the district, and a genuine commitment to demonstrating the positive impact these devices would have on student safety. I am pleased to announce that the Thomas Smith Memorial Foundation has generously pledged to donate seven new AEDs to our district. This foundation, also known as "Tommy's Heart," has a straightforward mission statement: "To prevent families from suffering the loss of a child, by providing early detection and education for teenage heart ailments." Across Michigan, Tommy's Heart has been instrumental in equipping schools with life-saving AED devices and providing crucial education on cardiac health to staff and students. Their proactive approach has undoubtedly made a tangible difference in promoting student safety and preventing potential tragedies statewide. On behalf of all of our students, their families, and our staff at TCAPS, I would like to thank the Thomas Smith Memorial Foundation for their support and generous donation.
