Attendance:

Attendance is important to the success of our club. An important component of Kiwanis membership is PARTICIPATION in club projects and activities. The Kiwanis Club of Traverse City is a very active club and you will have a large selection of activities and projects in which to participate.

History of Kiwanis:

- Kiwanis was organized in 1915 in Detroit, MI as a Businessmen's Club.
- It soon after changed its goals to that of a Community Service Club.
- The Six Constitutional Objects of Kiwanis were adopted in 1924.
- Since its founding in 1915, Kiwanis has grown to about 8,500 clubs in more than 70 countries.
- The Kiwanis Club of Traverse City was chartered in 1924. This club has helped start many other Kiwanis Clubs in Northern Michigan.

Kiwanis Leadership

The club is managed by the officers of the club and it's Board of Directors. The officers of the club are elected by membership each year and include: President, President-Elect, VP, Secretary and Treasurer.

The Board of Directors serves three year terms and is elected by membership. The club's Board of Directors include 9 members with tiered terms. The President of the Club serves as Chairperson of the Board.

The club's activities are managed by four primary committees:
